Plumber

Whether your interest in the plumbing profession flows from your methodical nature or your desire to work with your hands, the Plumber Apprenticeship program will train you for an essential trade. You'll learn the ins and outs of plumbing and discover how to keep water, waste and gas flowing to or from homes and businesses.

- be prepared to write the First Period Alberta Apprenticeship Examination.
- be prepared to be employed within the Plumbing, Pipefitting, Gasfitting, or Sprinkler-fitting industries in Alberta.

- English 30-2, Math 30-3, Physics 30 or Chemistry 30 or Science 30 and related career and technology studies courses recommended.
- Successful completion of English 20-2, Math 20-3 and Science 10, or entrance exam.

- The Pre-Employment Plumbing Program prepares and allows students to write the First Year Gasfitter/Plumber Provincial Apprenticeship Exam. The Pre-Employment Plumbing Program covers all material in The First Year Alberta Gasfitter/Plumber (Pipe Trades) Apprenticeship curriculum.
- You are responsible for providing all of your own Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) such as CSA Approved steel-toed work boots, safety glasses, coveralls, etc.
